
We will begin with a guided tour of **Reiman Gardens**, lowa State University's horticultural garden established in 1914. Reiman Gardens is one of the finest and most unique gardens in the country. The guided tour will highlight the **Christina Reiman Butterfly Wing**, a tropical paradise home to 800 live butterflies; **Hughes Conservatory**, a glass house featuring a lush, tropical collection of colorful and rare plants among seasonal, artistic creations that interpret garden themes and intrigue guests; and **Jones Rose Garden**, a garden diplaying the most popular flower in the world. After the tour, guests will have the opportunity to visit the Reiman Gardens **Gift Shop** and view other areas of the Gardens.



We will enjoy a delicious lunch at Reiman Gardens and guests will have the opportunity to listen to a presentation on **Garden Design with Pollinators** presented by one of Reiman Gardens professional staff members.

After lunch, guest will continue with a guided tour of the **Farm House Museum**. Built in 1860, it was the first building on the Iowa State University campus and is a National Historic Landmark.

Guests will wind down the day with a tour and sampling of **Chocolaterie Stam**, a modern chocolaterie in downtown Ames steeped in old world, Dutch traditions since 1913. They are famous for their handcrafted white, milk and dark chocolate bonbons and other indulgent confections.



The guest tour will be \$25 or free with a paid 2-day guest registration. This fee covers transportation, lunch and all related fees. Vans will leave the hotel at 9:00AM sharp so please be near the front entrance of the hotel lobby by 8:50AM. The tour will return to the hotel by 4:00PM. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. The tour will be limited to the first 25 registered. Registration in advance is required. Please note, commissioner expenses (hotel stay & conference registration) are only covered for commissioners and assistants attending the conference. If a commissioner or assistant would like to attend the guest tour rather than the conference they will have to incur the expenses.
